MAT-VA WEBINAR REPORT FOR MAY 2020

On May 20th the MAT-VA program was honored to host Dr. Ajay Manhapra of Hampton, Virgina. His presentation, titled, "The conundrum of long-term opioids for pain: Darned if you do, darned if you don't", covered several timely topics. The 45 minute presentation answered questions about how to identify neurobehavioral mechanisms in pain relief and how they interact with opioids and other addictive substances while also describing the neurobehavioral mechanisms of the evolution of opioid dependence and addiction with regular use of opioids for pain relief. Dr. Manhapra also described in detail, the gray area between simple opioid dependence and opioid addiction and how to assess the impact of complex persistent dependence on pain and functionality in the context of the continuation and discontinuation of long-term opioids. At the close of his presentation Dr. Manahpra, described some strategies on how to manage patients with complex persistent opioid dependence. On May 27th, Dr. Hildi Hagedorn (PhD.) was kind enough to present her research paper, "Advancing pharmacological treatments for opioid use disorder (ADaPT-OUD): protocol for testing a novel strategy to improve implementation of medication-assisted treatment for veterans with opioid use disorders in low-performing facilities", to the MAT-VA Journal Club. Dr. Hagedorn's presentation focused on describing how ADAPT-OUD worked to improve MOUD access in several different VA sites across the country. Barriers and facilitators of implementation were discussed in detail. Of note – perspectives of both patients and providers in the intervention were shared, as well as lessons learned from each group. The discussion on how to identify strong "Internal Facilitators" is highly recommended for those seeking to implement new programs at VA sites.
